

Jamestown Community College/ SUNY Fredonia Transfer Articulation Agreement in Early Childhood Education/Childhood Education

By this agreement, students who complete the Associate of Science (A.S.) Liberal Arts and Sciences: Childhood Education (Teacher Education Transfer) or A.S. Liberal Arts and Sciences: Early Childhood Education (Teacher Education Transfer) at Jamestown Community College (JCC) are guaranteed admission with full junior standing to the Bachelor of Science (B.S.) Education degree at SUNY Fredonia (Fredonia). Students will choose one of the following certification areas at Fredonia:

Childhood Education (Grades 1-6)

Childhood Inclusive Education (Grades 1-6 & Students with Disabilities Grades 1-6)

Early Childhood Education (Birth-Grade 2)

Early Childhood/Childhood Education (Birth-Grade 2 & Grades 1- 6)

Depending on the certification area(s) that they choose, students can generally complete the bachelor's degree in four or five semesters at Fredonia. Students can contact Fredonia for details.

Students can transfer up to 75 JCC credits toward meeting requirements for their bachelor's degree at Fredonia.

All programs and degree options in the Fredonia College of Education lead to New York State Certification and are subject to the guidelines and mandates established by New York State. Additionally, all programs and degree options must comply with Council for Accreditation of Educator Preparation (CAEP) standards. Therefore, any changes made by the New York State Board of Regents, State University of New York (SUNY) system, or CAEP may impact the requirements of the program. Fredonia reviews undergraduate programs each semester for compliance with state and national accreditation requirements.

Minimum Bachelor's Degree Requirements

Bachelor's degree requirements are stated in the Fredonia college catalog. Minimum requirements for a Fredonia degree include

- 1) 120-126 unduplicated credit hours [the following degree programs require 126 credit hours:
 - Early Childhood Education (Birth-Grade 2)
 - Early Childhood/Childhood Education (Birth-Grade 2 & Grades 1- 6),
- 2) 45 credit hours in residency at Fredonia,
- 3) a cumulative quality point average (GPA) of 3.0 for Education degrees,
- 4) 66 credits from disciplines other than the major discipline, and
- 5) 45 upper level (300 and above) credit hours.

Candidacy Information

To be admitted into any Fredonia Teacher Education Program, students must meet the following requirements:

1. minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0,
2. proof of completion of SAT, ACT, or GRE,
3. the equivalent of EDU 105 /106 Introduction to Contemporary Inclusive Education (JCC Equivalent is EDU 1510 Foundations of Education – Teaching Profession or EDU 2210 Field Placement I – Education) with a grade of B or above,
4. the equivalent of EDU 225 Child Development (JCC PSY 2520 Child Development) with a grade of B or above.

NOTE – If the equivalent coursework is not completed, students may be conditionally admitted to their programs by Fredonia.

Required SUNY General Education/Fredonia Foundations

Requirements for the A.S. Liberal Arts and Sciences: Childhood Education (Teacher Education Transfer) and the A.S. Liberal Arts and Sciences: Early Childhood Education (Teacher Education Transfer) at JCC include completion of the SUNY General Education Requirement of 7 of 10 categories, including Math and **Basic Communication** and a minimum of 30 credits (7/10/30). By satisfying this requirement, students will have also satisfied the Fredonia Foundations general education requirement. There are additional certification requirements in natural science and foreign language. These courses may also be used to meet SUNY General Education and Fredonia Foundations requirements.

Natural Science

To meet certification requirements, students must complete one 3-credit natural science course, which can be transferred from JCC provided it is listed on the student's GETA (SUNY General Education transcript). This course cannot be in computer science or geographic information systems.

US History

To meet certification requirements, students must complete a course in US history. Students can meet this requirement by taking one JCC course that satisfies the SUNY General Education American History requirement and having it indicated on the GETA.

Foreign Language Requirement

All education majors are required to demonstrate proficiency in a foreign language. This requirement will be satisfied as part of the A.S. degree at JCC. All students must be proficient through the JCC 1520 level. The foreign language proficiency will be indicated on the GETA.
